



## RESPONSIBLE SERVICE OF ALCOHOL POLICY

### POLICY OBJECTIVE

To provide a safe environment for our Members and guests by ensuring the Kogarah Clubhouse Team are lawful and responsible in our service of alcohol in relation to intoxication and under-age drinking.

### RESPONSIBLE SERVICE OF ALCOHOL POLICY

The Responsible service, reporting and actioning of this policy will be designated to both Management and staff at Kogarah Clubhouse.

#### Intoxication:

- All employees will hold a current New South Wales R.S.A Competency card and be trained and responsible for the correct dispensing and dosage of alcoholic beverages.
- Kogarah Clubhouse staff will serve only single shot alcoholic beverages
- Kogarah Clubhouse will not promote excessive consumption of alcohol
- Kogarah Clubhouse will not unfairly target men or women
- Kogarah Clubhouse will not provide free alcoholic beverages.
- Water will be freely available within all areas of Kogarah Clubhouse. A diverse range of appealing, non-alcoholic beverages will be on offer and displayed on our Menus.
- Light and mid-strength alcoholic beverages will be available to encourage responsible consumption of alcohol.
- Food will be available for patrons during the entirety of the days trade.
- A person deemed intoxicated by any member of staff, will be refused further service in a discreet and polite manner, and will be assisted, as far as possible, with transportation home.
- A person deemed to be intoxicated will not gain entry to Kogarah Clubhouse
- Failure to leave the Venue when requested will result in Police intervention and a fine of \$500.

#### Under-age Drinking:

- Any persons entering the Club will need to present valid Identification as proof of age.
- A minor will be refused entry unless they are under the supervision of an adult. The responsible adult must be over the age of 25, or at the discretion of the Manager on Duty.
- Any employee may ask for Proof of Age at any time, even if entry has been granted.
- No alcohol can be purchased by or for, or on behalf of a Minor. Any attempt to do so will result in Police intervention.
